What is the Oxford Flood Alleviation Scheme?

The Environment Agency are working with partners to develop proposals to reduce flood risk to over 1000 homes and businesses and major transport routes across Oxford.

Earlier this year, we held a public consultation on a series of options to create more space in the western floodplain, by enlarging and deepening existing rivers and streams and constructing areas of new channel.

We have reviewed your feedback to help us analyse the options. We also considered technical factors such as reduction in flood risk, construction, cost, impact on residents and the environment.

We now have a preferred option for the route of the scheme and will shortly begin to work on the design. This event is your opportunity to view the proposals and discuss them with us.
