20.22 NEW ISSUES

A State of car park at Playfield Road

Residents had complained about the danger to cars and residents due to the holes in the car park. Cllr. Feather had requested three quotes to carry out repair work – unfortunately only two quotes have been returned, one being in the sum of £2,500 and the other £1,600.

21.22 It was agreed that the lower estimate of £1,600 be recommended to full council at it's meeting on 13 October 2022. This was proposed by Cllr. Mrs Buckingham seconded by Cllr. Smith and agreed by all

B Tree in Forest Side car park

The tree at the time of sending out agenda had split down the middle and needed to be taken down. Since then tree collapsed and was dealt with as urgent so was felled, cut up and the stump ground up.

22.22 CONTINUING ISSUES

A The concrete post at Forest Side playing field car park needs putting back, preventing vehicles entering the field. The concrete post is in the beech hedge next to the car park.

ACTION FOR CLERK - To arrange for post to be put in place

- **B** Clerk has requested a contractor to carry out the annual Gas inspection for Playfield Road Pavilion.
- Clerk received request from Oxfordshire Skill Acquisition to hire Forest Side playing field and pavilion on 24 27 October from 9-3pm (school half-term). Mr Baker explained that the Football Club has spent a considerable amount of money on improving and maintaining the pitches and the extreme weather conditions over the past six months has taken its toll. So much so that the club has moved it's training to neighbouring Radley pitches in an attempt to save Kennington's.
- **23.22 It was agreed** that having an extensive period of use would do nothing but more damage to the pitches so would have to decline Oxfordshire Skill Acquisition's request. This was proposed by Cllr. Mrs Buckingham seconded by Cllr. Smith and agreed unanimously.

ACTION FOR CLERK - To inform Oxfordshire Skill Acquisition of the Committee's decision

C Clerk requested a quote for a Legionella Risk Assessment from Prime Compliance Services who carried it out last time. £275.00

Clerk also requested prices for carrying out all the necessary testing except running the showers for 5 minutes every week. i.e.

- 1. Monthly carry out
- a. Sentinel outlet temperature monitoring checks
- b. Calorifier temperature checks
- 2. Three monthly shower head descale and disinfection
- 3. Six monthly water tank temperatures
- 4. Annual water tank inspection

£900.00

6 monthly water samples a. Take water samples from site to give an overview of the water system

- b. Samples to be analysed by an independent UKAS approved lab
- c. Provide Certificate of Sampling
- d. Provide recommendations of action to be taken as determined by results

Samples as follows: 3 No legionella samples to be taken each six months

25.22 Cllr. Patterson suggested getting in touch with Vale of White Horse District Council's Leisure Services to ask who carries out their monitoring. There could be a chance of getting onto the back of their deal.

ACTION FOR CLERK – To contact the Vale's Leisure Services and enquire

- Clerk reported that the Village Warden is on extended leave, resulting in Calber taking over the cleaning of the pavilion and clearing rubbish/emptying litter bins at both playing fields.
- **E** RoSPA inspections have been carried out with reports showing mainly maintenance tasks to the play equipment and areas. These reports are on next weeks agenda for discussion at the Council meeting.

F Work has been carried out on the water heaters for the Playfield Road pavilion and although has not been tested as yet it is hoped that they will be up and working for this Saturday.

26.22 DAY OF FUTURE REGULAR COMMITTEE MEEINGS

During the summer months the Cricket Club members would find Wednesday evenings difficult to attend, as they have matches on this evening. However the arranged dates for the rest of the year were fine by them and also by everyone else around the table.

27.22 PLAYFIELD ROAD PAVILION PROJECT

Cllr. Feather had spoken with the architect (who carried out work for Council before) over the summer explaining that £1.6 million would not be a goer. A price of £600,000 was suggested. Architect thought that a pavilion with the necessary two x changing rooms etc to comply with Sport England could be achieved. Architect's scale of charges would be:

Initial design layout £4,500 Planning etc £3,500 Access statement £1,600

It was felt that even at £600,000 this was as inaccessible as £1.6 million. Mr Crouch suggested that renovating the existing pavilion would be an alternative. £200,000 could give the village a very good sporting facility. This way forward was agreed by the rest of those at the meeting.

28.22 CRICKET CLUB HIRE FEES FOR 2023

Mr Crouch proposed an annual hire fee of approx. £500 for 2023. Below is his explanation for this sum: He thanked the Committee for the two seasons without fees and explained that during this time the Cricket Club had spent time and money in improving the pitch, at present 5 bags of manure had been spread on the pitch in readiness for next year. The Cricket Club's season is for 17 weeks of 26 weekend games and 14 week day matches (Wednesday). At Cutteslowe Park Cricket pitch they pay £2,500 which includes all preparation of the pitch. With regard to Kennington's Cricket pitch Mr Robins has been preparing the pitch, putting in around 6 hours per week at nominal cost of £20 per hour. To continue this into next season (2023) if the Cricket Club were to pay equivalent to Cutteslowe, after paying Mr Robins' costs that would leave approximately £500 for the remaining hire fees. The Cricket Club would continue to put money into maintaining and improving the pitch. Cllr. Feather will take this for discussion at the Council meeting of 13 October 2022 and report back at the next Playing Fields meeting.
